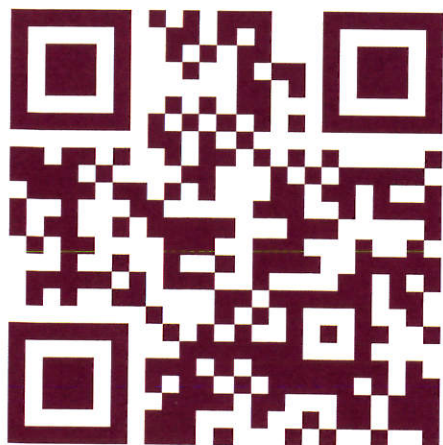

This report will highlight the statutorily required reporting of the finances and administrative activities of the County (NCGS 153A-82).

As we continue efforts to make government more efficient and accountable, this past year has brought several milestones. Construction of the new Yadkin County Detention Center was completed in November of 2013, the Health Department and Department of Social Services were combined in February of 2013 creating the Yadkin County Human Services Agency, and the property tax rate was lowered from 0.69 to 0.679 per \$100 of value.

We look forward to 2014 and beginning the construction on the Agricultural Center and the East Bend Water line.

In closing, thank you for being part of our County.

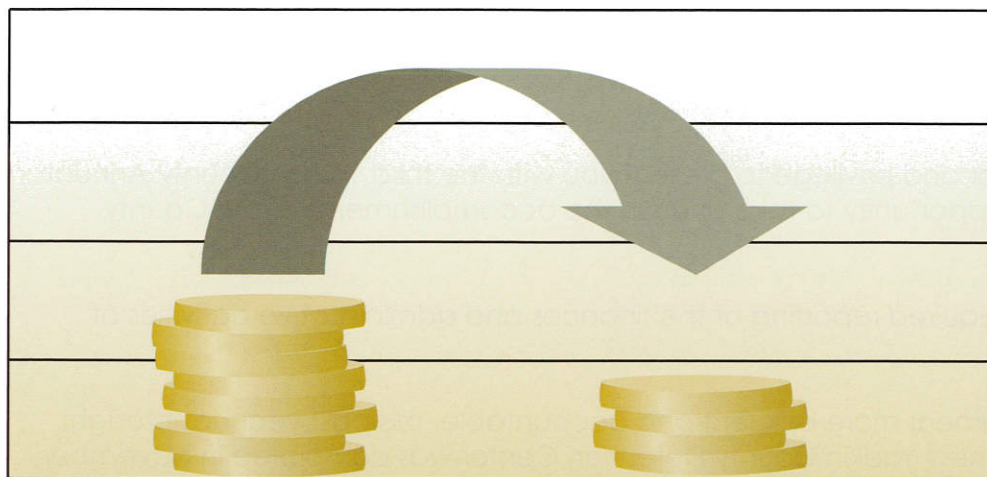

4 | Property Tax

THE TAX RATE HAS BEEN LOWERED TO .679 IN THE FY 2013-2014 BUDGET.



Some Interesting Facts:

- County property taxes amount to approximately \$19,000,000 in revenue for the County.
- In the month of August the County gives a 2% discount for early payment of taxes. During this month the Taxpayers of Yadkin County will pay approximately 55% of the outstanding taxes for the year.
- The County exempts approximately \$250,000 in taxes each year for the elderly, disabled and veteran exemptions.
- The County is scheduled for another reappraisal of real property in 2017.
- The County offers a payment plan for taxpayers that will result in their current taxes being paid by the end of December each year.
- Taxpayers can visit www.yadkincountync.gov to view property deeds and records, locate your property on the county map, and pay your taxes online.

2013 Fire Tax:

In addition to the \$0.69 County tax on your tax bill, there is also a fire tax. This tax is collected by the County and forwarded to each fire department. Below is the fire tax rate for each district. The rates are requested by each fire department and approved by the County Commissioners.

How to Calculate Taxes:

The 2014 tax rate for Yadkin County is 0.679. This means property will be taxed at 0.679 cents per \$100 value. For example, If your home is appraised at \$150,000 here is the formula:

LAST YEAR

$$\$150,000 / 100 \times 0.69 = \$1,035.00$$

THIS YEAR

$$\$150,000 / 100 \times .679 = \$1,018.50$$

Human Services | 5

In 2012, North Carolina lawmakers created a new law giving all counties the option to consolidate the Department of Social Services and the Health Department, an option that the two largest counties in the state (Wake and Mecklenburg) have had available and have successfully implemented for years.

At the February 18th, 2013 Yadkin County Commissioners Meeting a Public Hearing was held on the consolidation of the Department of Social Services and the Health Department. After the hearing the Commissioners voted to combine the two departments to create a Human Services Agency, and appoint a Human Services Advisory Committee. The Human Services Advisory Committee consists of the same type of positions as Board of Health and the Department of Social Service Board had prior: physician, engineer, dentist, nurse, veterinarian, as well as citizen members. Kim Harrell who was previously the Department of Social Services Director was sworn in as the Human Services Director.

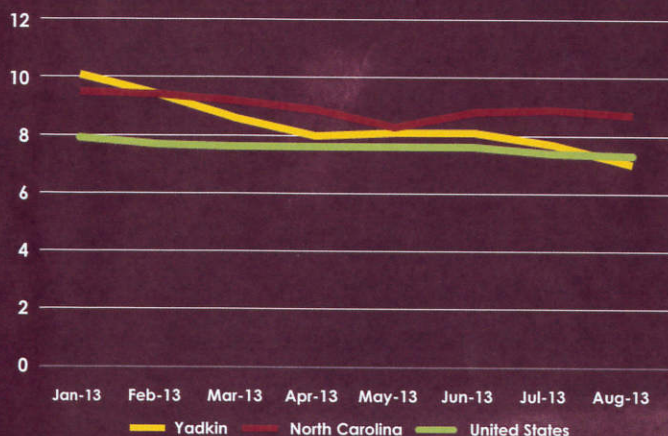

Travel & Tourism in Yadkin County

Yadkin County and the Yadkin Valley continue to grow as a tourism destination, driven by our wineries, Civil War Trail markers, Quilt Trail, and the



Yadkin Cultural Arts Center. Two new wineries are joining the existing twelve currently in Yadkin County. The Yadkin Valley Wine Company in Hamptonville is now open and Sweet Home Carolina Vineyard and Winery in the Forbush area will open in the spring of 2014.

- Domestic tourism in Yadkin County generated an economic impact of \$32.38 million in 2012, an increase of 3.43 % from 2011.
- In 2012 Yadkin County ranked 69, moving up one spot, in travel impact among North Carolina's 100 Counties.
- Travel generated a \$5.34 million payroll in 2012.

- State and local tax revenues from travel to Yadkin County amounted to \$2.47 million. This represents a \$64.58 tax saving to each county resident.

Movie Industry

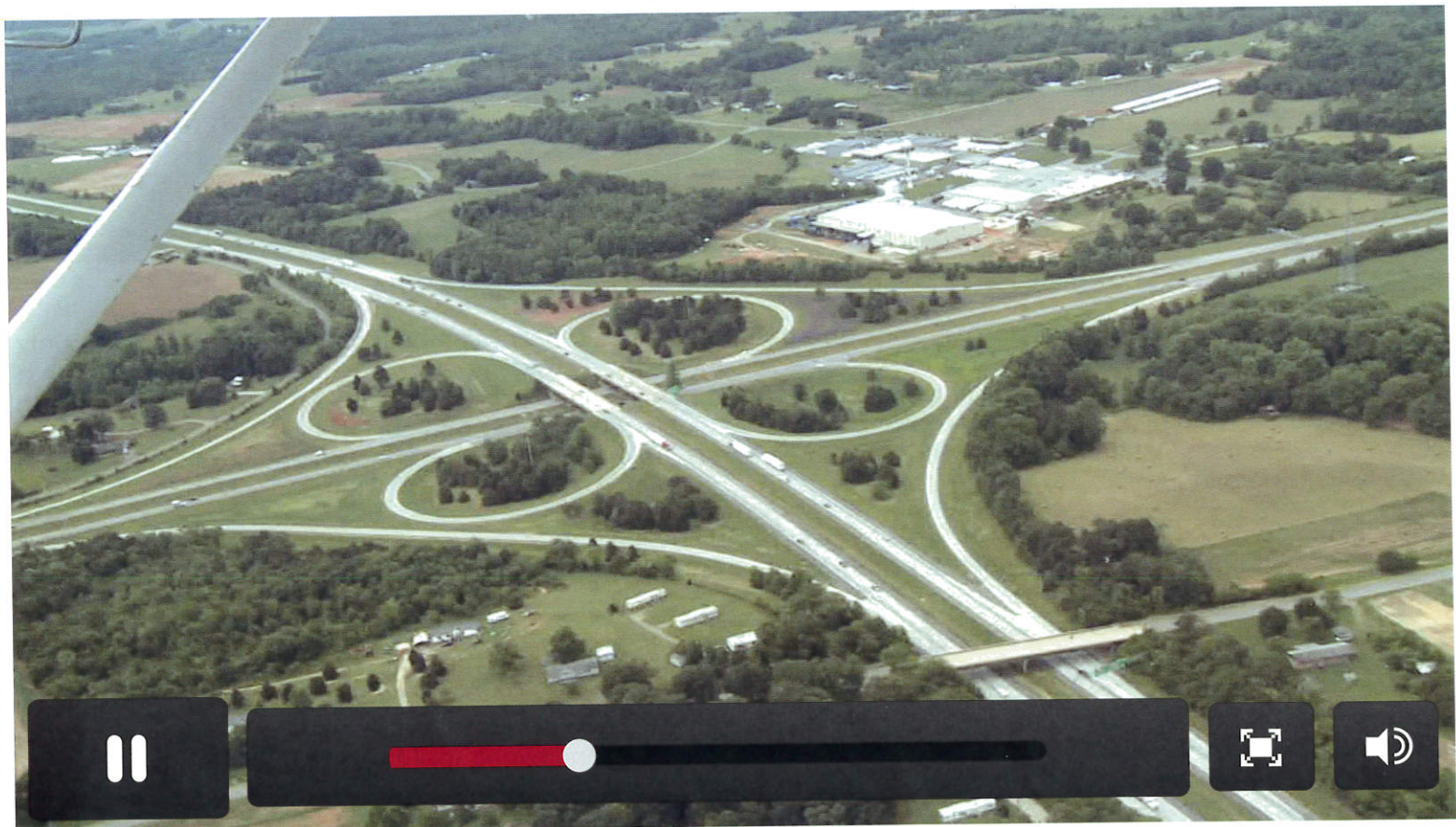

Fishing Pier to be constructed at the 5D Reservoir Park in 2014.

The N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission will stock approximately 400 channel catfish per month into the Yadkin County Park Lake between May and October of each year, beginning in 2014. Fishing in the lake will be open to anglers with a valid N.C. fishing license free of charge. Anglers less than age 16 do not need a fishing license. An ADA-compliant fishing pier will be constructed by the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission by spring/early summer 2014. All money spent by the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission comes from a combination of revenue from fishing license sales and the Federal Aid in Sport Fish Restoration Act.

In addition to the fishing pier, construction is expected to begin by the end of the year on a boat launch, walking trails, picnic shelter, and playground. This facility is based on citizen input from the comprehensive master park plan adopted in January 2012.

Yadkin County Park

Yadkin County Parks and Recreation has completed the construction of three new parking lots at the County Park. These parking lots provide residents the opportunity to visit the park for games and events that in the past would not be able to attend due to the limited availability of parking. They are located in close proximity of the field so that all citizens may enjoy the activities at the park.

The County provides approximately **\$7,000,000** a year to local educational capital and operations. A portion of this funding is used for supplemental teacher pay. Approximately twenty percent (**20%**) of your property tax money goes to education.

The Yadkin County School District is nestled in the foothills of the beautiful Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina, and serves approximately **5,800** students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through grade 12. The district is made up of fourteen schools, eight elementary schools; two middle schools; two traditional high schools; one alternative school and the Yadkin County Early College High School. Yadkin County Schools are rich in academics, athletics, the arts as well as having numerous extra-curricular activity successes. Educators welcome the opportunity to serve students and parents living in our many communities throughout Yadkin County.

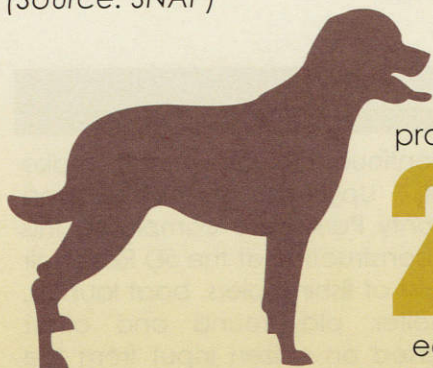

- It's cost effective: the surgery is cheaper than caring for a litter of puppies or kittens, reduces the chance you would have to pay for a vet bill due to aggression, or quarantine due to biting a human.
- Would be more likely to stay close to home. As many as **85%** of dogs hit by cars are not altered.
- Reduces animal over-population. Every year more animals come in to the animal shelter than are there are available homes/adopters. We want to see euthanasia due to over population end, spaying and neutering is an important step to this goal.

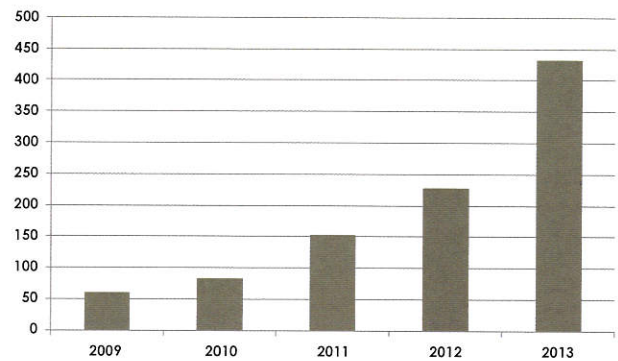

Register of Deeds

By law, the Register of Deeds Office serves as custodian and manager of a large number of public records. The Register of Deeds is legally charged with the integrity, completeness, accuracy and safekeeping of these public records. This amounts to approximately 5,400 documents and plats recorded and 300 marriage licenses issued each year. The documents recorded include deeds, deeds of trust, powers of attorneys, separation agreements, plats, deed of trust cancellations and various agreements. The office also issues certified copies of birth, death and marriage records. The annual revenue collected is approximately \$300,000 for these various recordings and services.

We use the most current technology to ensure easy access and retrieval of all our records and provide a courteous and professional environment. Everyday registry employees work tirelessly to ensure that the documents we record reflect the trust that our patrons place in us. This commitment to excellence is the very foundation of our service.

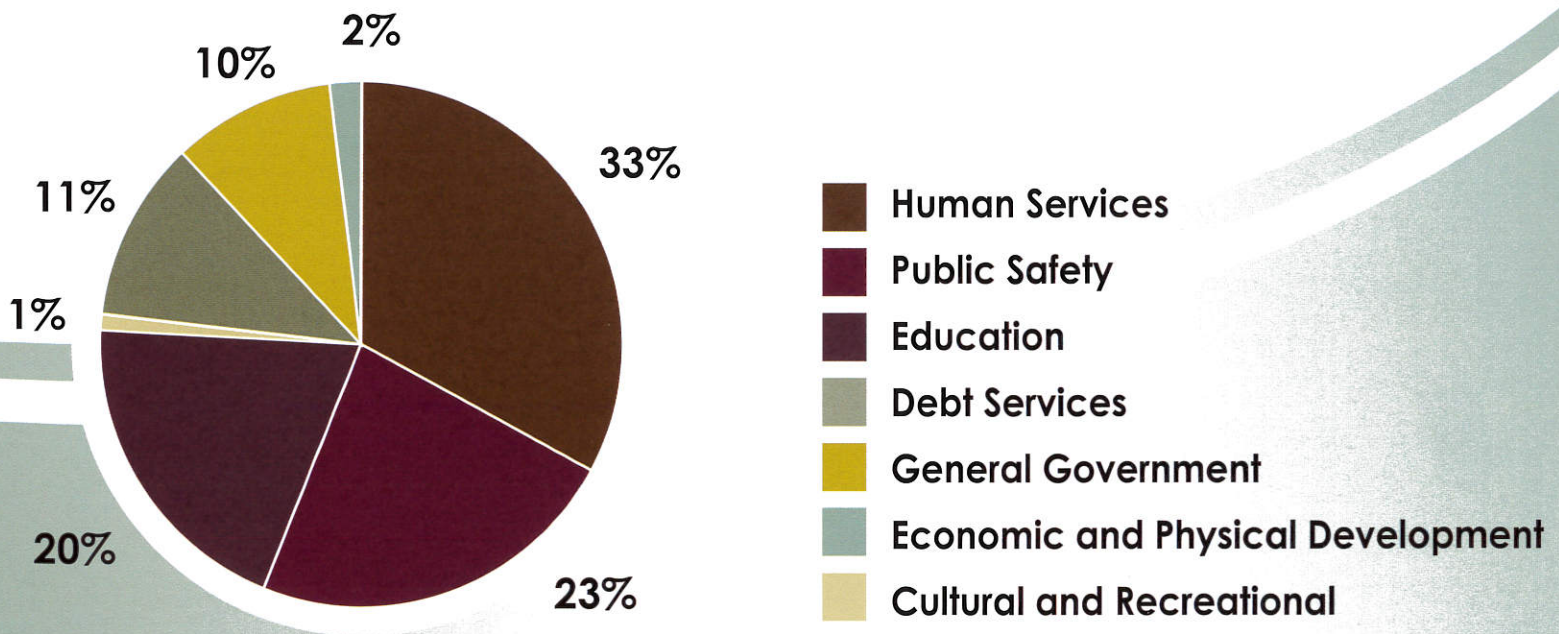

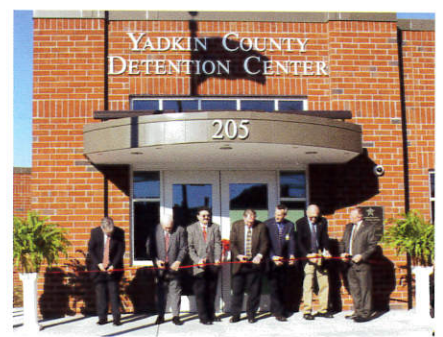


Yadkin County Detention Center

Construction was completed on the new Yadkin County Detention Center in November of 2013. The Detention Center is a maximum security holding facility, and trippled the total number of inmates able to be held in the County. The previous detention facility housed up to twenty-nine (29) male inmates pretrial or serving a sentence of less than ninety (90) days. The new Center will be able to house 101 total inmates- 72 male and 29 female at a time. Prior to having this facility the county was working with other counties to cover the housing needs for inmates.

The Detention Center is tasked with protecting inmates from themselves and others, as well as meeting inmates' needs for basic wellbeing. New Detention officers have been hired and trained to staff the new facility. The new Center adjoins the previous facility, at 205 East Cherry Street, in Yadkinville.
