

YADKIN COUNTY DOG PARK CLOSURE INFORMATION

Due to the success of the Dog Park, Yadkin County Parks and Recreation has implemented measures designed to promote healthy turf. It is our goal to provide a safe, clean, and well-maintained facility for your enjoyment.

PLANNED CLOSURES

Weekly: Yadkin County Dog Park will be closed every Thursday for routine maintenance , March through November.

Seasonally & As Needed: Yadkin County Dog Park will be closed for extended periods seasonally and as needed. Closures will be for, but not limited to: sod installation, seeding and fertilization, aerification, irrigation maintenance, fence/gate maintenance and repair.

UNPLANNED CLOSURES

Weather: Yadkin County Parks & Recreation reserves the right to close the entire Dog Park prior to, during and following any weather events. Weather that may prompt closures includes rain, frost, snow, ice, drought or any other event that may have a negative impact on turf/site conditions. Closures will be for, but not limited to: total saturation, customer and pet safety and probability of damage to turf.

Turf Rest & Recovery: Yadkin County Parks & Recreation reserves the right to close the entire dog park at any time to promote healthy turf. This includes closing to allow the turf to rest during periods of stress and recover as needed.

Repairs: Yadkin County Parks & Recreation reserves the right to close the entire Dog Park at any time to make repairs to any element such as benches, fencing, gates, water fountains, irrigation, turf or any other repair needs.

PLEASE REMEMBER...

Pet Waste: Remove any waste created by your dog(s). Doing so promotes a clean, healthy facility and encourages all dog owners to do the same. Waste litter stations are located throughout the Yadkin County Park and within the Dog Park.

Large & Small Dog Areas: Keep your dog in the appropriate section of Yadkin County Dog Park. This is for the safety of you, your dog(s) and others.

Dog Toys: Remove any items that you bring into the Dog Park such as dog toys, balls, and water bowls.

Digging: Do not allow your dog(s) to dig holes as this damages the turf and creates a safety risk.

On-Leash: When outside the Yadkin County Dog Park, your dog must be leashed.
