

Qualifications

- Must be a registered voter in the precinct for which you are applying.
- Must be a resident of the county and of good repute.
- Computer literate
- Must be able to read and write.
- Must not be an elected government official or a chair, manager or treasurer for any candidate or political party.
- Must not be a candidate in the election.

How you are Appointed/ Selected

The BOE office compiles a list of recommended applicants that is provided to the county political party officials. The parties then make their recommendations to the county Board of Elections who appoints Judges for a two-year term beginning in August of odd-numbered years. Assistants are appointed per election by the county Board of Elections.

Available Positions

The **CHIEF JUDGE** is the head official and is in charge of Election Day activities, as well as picking up and returning Election Day supplies.

The **PARTY JUDGES** work closely with the Chief Judge and are responsible for conducting the election in the Chief Judge's absence. The **PRECINCT ASSISTANTS** serve during major elections under the direction of the Chief Judge.

Training

All officials are required to attend Training sessions conducted by the board of elections prior to each election.

Compensation

Precinct officials are compensated for their time spent training and for Election day.

Training- \$25.00

Election Day-\$11.00 HR

Chief Judge-Pick up supplies-\$50.00

Chief Judge-Return supplies-\$50.00

Election Day Checklist

- ✓ Report to work at 6:00 am.
- ✓ Wear comfortable clothing.
- ✓ Do not wear campaign buttons or political apparel.
- ✓ Do not discuss politics, **NO ACCEPTIONS.**
- ✓ Arrange for enough food and drinks for the duration of the day.
- ✓ Smoking is not permitted in the polling place.

NOTICE TO APPLICATION - PLEASE READ AND SIGN BELOW

Applying for appointment does not guarantee a position at your precinct. All applications must be processed, but only those approved by the Elections Board are appointed to serve as Judges. All Assistants are appointed per election by the county board. All Precinct Officials must be registered to vote in Yadkin County, of good repute, and able to read and write. No more than one Judge in each precinct is to belong to the same political party as the Chief Judge. No person shall be eligible who holds any elected government office. No person shall be eligible to serve as a Precinct Official who is a candidate for nomination or election. No person shall be eligible to serve as a Precinct Official who serves as a political precinct chair, however, the position of Delegate to a political party convention is allowable. The following categories of relatives are prohibited from serving as Precinct Officials of the same precinct: spouse, child, spouse of a child, sister, or brother. (This rule also applies to emergency election-day assistants). No Precinct Official who is the wife, husband, mother, father, son, daughter, brother or sister of any candidate for nomination or election may serve as Precinct Official during any primary or election in which said candidate is on the ballot. The Board of Elections may remove any Precinct Official for failure to attend mandatory training, not following the code of conduct on Election Days, general misbehavior, neglect of duty, or insubordination toward Board of Elections Staff or the Precinct's Chief Judge.
